Batesville kicks off the holiday season

The annual holiday parade and tree lighting ceremony brought hundreds of families to downtown Batesville on the evening of November 30.

Children, parents and grandparents lined the streets to get a glimpse of Santa during the parade. Mayor Mike Bettice, Santa and James then hosted the official Tree Lighting Ceremony.



The holiday festival featured reindeer, festive music, carriage rides, food vendors, Elfie Selfies and meet-and-greet with Santa.

Chinese Sister City visits Batesville

The City of Batesville hosted a delegation from its Sister City, Haiyan County, China, on Monday December 3.

The exchange began with opening remarks and a gift exchange by Mayor Mike Bettice and his counterpart, Zhu Beihua, Vice Director of The Standing Committee of the People's Congress of Haiyan County.



The six Chinese delegates joined city officials for tours of Hill-Rom, Weberding Carving Shop, The Sherman, Batesville Area Historical Center, St. Andrews Health Campus and Batesville Community School Corporation.

This marked the second delegation from Haiyan County to visit Batesville, the first time being the establishment of the Sister City relationship in 2013.

“Our two cities are vastly different in many ways, for example, Haiyan County has a much larger population,” said Mayor Mike Bettice. “However, we found plenty of common ground and I believe our hospitality, educational programs and our culture made a positive impact on them.”

The Sister City relationship was formed in 2013 to promote exchanges and cooperation in the fields of economy, trade, culture and education.

Batesville is one of twelve Indiana cities to have a sister-city relationship with a community in the Chinese province of Zhejiang.



Park named in honor of veterans

The City of Batesville dedicated a downtown park as Veterans Park in mid-November. A ceremony was held at the park which is located at the intersection of South and Depot streets on November 12.

City officials joined the VFW, American Legion and Patriot Guard for the dedication which included many U.S. flags, a 21-gun salute and Taps.



“It is important we honor the brave men and women who served in the military. Today I ask all citizens of Batesville to take time to remember and give all of our veterans, servicemen and women the upmost respect,” Mayor Mike Bettice said as the new sign was officially unveiled.

The dedication of the park marked a century since Armistice Day, November 11, 1918, which was the end of World War I.

Where do the City’s Christmas trees come from?

Bohman Christmas Tree Farm in Enochsburg provided the Christmas tree which is located at the Memorial Building.

Since 1968, the family farm has been a Christmas tradition for thousands of families. On Friday, November 30, the City held the official Tree Lighting Ceremony at the downtown Bike Park. That Christmas tree is donated by Sheets Christmas Tree Farm.

Sheets has the proud distinction of being honored by the State of Indiana with the Hoosier Homestead Farm Sesquicentennial Award. The award is reserved for farms that have been in the family for over 150 years.

The tree farm had the prestigious honor of supplying the White House Christmas Tree in 1968. Sheets Christmas Tree Farm is located at 5679 N Co Rd 200 E, in Osgood.

Those residents living SOUTH of Pearl Street will have their garbage collected on Saturday, December 29, 2018 and Saturday, January 5, 2019.



Batesville opens roads to ATV, ORV traffic

Batesville City Council approved an ordinance in November that allows all-terrain vehicles (ATV) and off-road vehicles (ORV) to drive on city roads.

Riders must abide by state law which requires drivers to be at least 18 and have valid insurance. The vehicle would have to be registered with the City every two years.

The off-road vehicles are banned from city streets from midnight to 6 a.m. every day.

Ordinance violations are subjected to fines, suspensions and even a lifetime ban, depending on the infraction.

Building Improvement Grant applications due Dec. 31

The City of Batesville's Building Improvement Grant (BIG) provides matching funds to business and property owners wanting to renovate the exterior of their structure.

Applications for the final round of the program are due by December 31, 2018.

This is a matching grant program where tenants and property owners can receive dollar for dollar matching funds of up to \$5,000 to finance direct costs associated with approved renovation activities. Proposed project must be completed within six months of signing of Grant Agreement.

The Economic Development Commission, in their sole discretion, will determine grant recipients in January 2019.

Eligibility

The grant is for owners and store tenants who wish to renovate the façade of their building. Tenants must have approval from the building owner and have at least two years remaining on their lease or an option to renew to receive funding. Grant funds must be used for permanent exterior/façade improvements.
